# Draft BCA 2011 available for public comment

# **Purpose**

To advise a draft of proposed amendments to the 2011 edition of the Building Code of Australia (BCA) is now available for public comment.

# **Background**

The BCA is updated annually, with the 2011 edition due for commencement on 1 May 2011. Draft proposals have been developed to amend Volume One and Volume Two of the BCA.

The BCA 2011 public comment drafts include proposed changes relating to slips, trips and falls, buildings in bushfire prone areas and significant changes to the BCA provisions for people with disabilities to align with the Commonwealth's Disability (Access to Premises – Buildings) Standards 2010.
