# Changes to Queensland Development Code Mandatory Parts 4.1— Sustainable buildings and 5.9—Buildings and structures in cyclonic areas

## Purpose

To advise the Queensland Development Code (QDC) Mandatory Part (MP) 4.1—Sustainable buildings (see <u>Newsflash 359</u>) has been amended and that QDC MP 5.9—Buildings and structures in cyclonic areas expires on 1 May 2009.

## Background

Since 1 March 2006, new and existing dwellings in Queensland have been required to comply with MP 4.1 requirements for energy and water efficiency features in new class 1 buildings, soleoccupancy units in class 2 buildings, and, where practicable, renovations.

In June 2008, the Queensland Government released the *Improving sustainable housing in Queensland* discussion paper (see <u>Newsflash 320</u>). Following public extensive consultation the QDC was amended on 1 March 2009 to further improve water and energy efficiency in the housing sector (see <u>Newsflash 346</u>). The changes included:

- minimum 5-star (out of 10) energy equivalence ratings for new houses from 1 March 2009
- better recognition of outdoor-indoor areas in building standards from 1 March 2009
- increased requirements for energy and water efficient fixtures in new houses from 1 March 2009
- a ban on the installation of air-conditioners that do not meet minimum performance requirements (4-star energy rating or energy efficiency ratio of at least 2.9) from 1 July 2009
- requirements for the installation of gas, solar or heat pump hot water systems in new class 1 buildings being transferred from QDC MP 4.1 to the Queensland Plumbing and Wastewater Code.

## Approved amendments to QDC MP 4.1

In response to stakeholder feedback, the following amendments to MP 4.1 have been approved and take effect from 1 May 2009:

- a definition for 'installation' for air conditioning has been included
- the definitions of 'air-conditioner', 'outdoor living area', and 'renovation' have been refined to assist in the interpretation of MP 4.1 and the term 'plumbing application' has been used instead of 'plumbing approval'
- references to the Queensland variation in Part 3.12—Energy efficiency in the Building Code of Australia (BCA) have been deleted as the variation will be removed from the BCA on 1 May 2009
- the requirement to have energy efficient lighting for a minimum of 80 per cent of the total fixed internal lighting, has been clarified as also applying to any enclosed class 10a buildings attached to class 1 or class 2 buildings







- the requirement of a minimum 2.9 Energy Efficiency Ratio (EER) for air-conditioners from 1 July 2009 has been specified as applying to new and replacement systems
- the application section has been simplified.

## Expiry of MP 5.9

Stakeholders were advised of the pending expiry on 1 May 2009 of MP 5.9—Buildings and structures in cyclonic areas, through earlier newsflashes (see <u>newsflashes 315, 339 and 359</u>). The expiry of MP 5.9 on 1 May 2009 has been confirmed by an amendment of the *Building Regulation 2006*.
