National Construction Code (NCC) 2022 - Free Webinar Series

Background

On 26 August 2022, a majority of Building Ministers agreed to introduce Modern Homes standards that cover both residential energy efficiency and accessible housing in NCC 2022. For more information read the <u>Building Minister's Meeting: Communiqué August 2022</u>.

The NCC 2022 will generally take effect from 1 May 2023, with the Modern Homes standards set to be transitioned for commencement from 1 October 2023.
